Intellectual Development

Goal: To continue to build a toolkit of skills in Math while building resiliency.

Rationale:

Teacher feedback continues to indicate that many students have an emergent set of skills when engaging with Math tasks and that there is a widening range of numeracy abilities in the classroom. Our goal is to narrow this range.

Planned Actions:

The numeracy support team will collaborate with our staff once a term to build our capacity in supporting our emergent learners over a range of topics. All students will have access to IXL accounts to support their learning. We will develop low floor, high ceiling numeracy tasks that each student across a grade level will complete each term. A group of teachers will be working to build thinking classrooms were vertical surfaces are used to support learning.

Indicators of Success:

- -Student self-assessment at the beginning and end of the year
- -FSA results in numeracy from year to year
- -Teacher feedback throughout the year
- -District numeracy support team feedback throughout the year
- -RTI data collected from teachers


School Community Engagement Process:

Planned Actions:



Indigenous Learners and Indigenous Ways of Learning

Area of focus:

Continue to connect Indigenous ways of learning to our core belief "Our Stories Matter". Continue to improve our understanding of ourselves, our connections to each other and place. Collaborating in innovative ways to share our stories.

Planned Actions:

Continue to use circle work and Restorative Practices that scaffolds knowledge among staff and increase understanding and connection between members of our community. Continue to use Mundy Park as a focus for opportunities to connect to sense of place. We continue to use a set of 28 drums created with Elder Dawn Brown. With the support of district our choir has recorded the Coast Salish anthem in Mundy Park. This recording will be used as at assemblies throughout the year.

Indicators of Success:

- -Consistent and intentional use of circles in classrooms
- -Anecdotal and street data indicates that our staff have a greater understanding of Indigenous Ways of Learning
- -Surveys of our staff and students

School Community Engagement Process:

Monthly newsletters and PAC meetings to invite the involvement in our community. Core belief of "Our Stories Matter" has been a consultative process. Indigenous youth worker continues to make connections to individual students and families in order to increase their connections to Hillcrest. Ongoing consultation of staff.
